Water Main Flushing

We will be **flushing city water mains April 5th—9th**. Don't be alarmed if you notice water running out of some hydrants. The flushing will happen between 9 am and 4 pm. If you notice any discoloration in your water, simply run it until it is clear. It is recommended not to do laundry during this time. First Brush Pickup on April 5th

Normally brush/yard waste pick up occurs on the 1st and 15th of each month. If the 1st or 15th falls on the weekend, pick up will be the following Monday. The first pickup this year is rescheduled for Monday April 5th. Please, place yard waste out only 48 hours prior to pickup, and do not place yard waste out after the scheduled pickup or you could be cited. Brush bundles should be no more than 25 pounds, no bigger than 4 ft long and 18 inches in diameter. **Leaves must be bagged in biodegradable paper bags for pick up.**



Tall Grass and Weeds

All premises and exterior property shall be maintained free from weeds and plant growth in excess of **10 inches**. All noxious weeds shall be prohibited. Weeds shall be defined as all grasses, annual plants and vegetation, other than trees or shrubs provided; however, this term shall not include cultivated flowers and gardens as well as wooded or forested lots. 1st offense; \$50. 2nd offense; \$100. 3rd offense; \$200. 4th offense; \$500.

Grant Farmers Market

Attention all **Vendors** — there will be a **vendor meeting** at City Hall on Saturday, May 1st at noon.

The farmer's market is located next to the water tower on M-37 and will be open every Saturday starting May 20th from 9 am—1 pm.

Free Yard & Garage Sale Permits

The City requires a permit for yard and garage sales. This permit is free and allows for residents to hold three (3) sales per year with a maximum duration of three (3) days per sale. No permit will be required for sales during the annual community-wide yard sale day which is always the first Saturday after Labor Day.

City Clean-up Event May 13th—May 15th

The City is once again hosting a dumpster for spring clean up. Residents may unload "**non-hazardous**" household waste into a dumpster at no charge. Once the dumpster is full, the clean-up event is over. Drop off hours: Thursday and Friday, noon—6:30pm, Saturday 9am to 1pm. Dumpster will be located at the end of Jones Street.

Free Burn Weekend May 14th—16th

Residents are encouraged to burn their brush and remaining leaves — as long as there is no DNR burn ban. Please check the City Facebook page for updates or electronic road sign.

Burn Permits

Remember that you must purchase a burn permit to burn in the city. Permits can be purchased at City Hall for \$20 and are good for 14 days from purchase. Always be sure to check that there has not been a burn ban issued. For more information, contact the DNR at www2.dnr.state.mi.us/burnpermits regarding burn bans.

Republic Services Bulk item pickup

First Tuesday of every month, Republic will pickup one bulky item measuring no more than 1 cubic yard (3'x3'x3') Additional/Larger items will need a bulk item tag good for any pickup day available at the City office for \$20.00 each.

Commission Meetings: 7pm at City Hall on the third Monday each month—April 19th, May 17th, June 21st

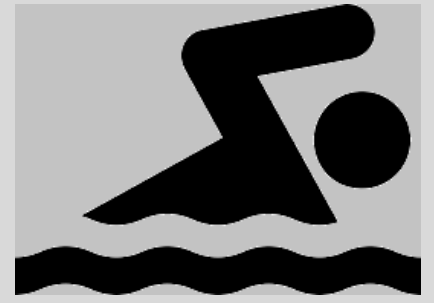
Other Public Meetings

Summer Time Rules and Ordinances

These rules are for your safety and peace of mind of everyone in our community. Please contact the city offices if you have any questions about our ordinances.

Minor Curfews

Per city Ordinance #34, no minors under the age of 17 may be out from 10pm to 6am. Aiding or abetting curfew violation for adults 17 and older is also an ordinance violation and you could be cited.

Loud Noise

Ordinance #44 prohibits loud noise generated by radios or other amplification devices. Please be courteous to your neighbors!

Pool Fencing Required

Per Ordinance #53 Section 303.1, private swimming pools, hot tubs and spas containing water more than 24 inches (2 ft) shall be completely surrounded by a fence or barrier at least 48 inches (4 ft) in height above the finished ground level measured on the side of the barrier away from the pool

Animal Ordinance Amended

Animal ordinance #21 amended to allow hens with restrictions based upon lot size and location—please see ordinance or call our office for more details.
